

5 DAY ITINERARY

Hobart and surrounds

Day 1 – Hobart

Distance and drive time: 20 km – 35 min

- Explore Sullivans Cove and Salamanca Market (every Saturday)
- Take a walking tour of Hobart or the Old Pub Tour of Hobart's colourful and historic pubs
- Drive or take a tour to the summit of kunanyi/Mt Wellington for spectacular views

Overnight Hobart

Day 2 – Hobart – Huon Valley

Distance and drive time: 180 km – 3 hr 30 min

- Head south towards Huonville, stopping in at one or two of the wineries or cider houses on the way
- Take a cave tour at Hastings Caves State reserve and a relaxing dip in the thermal springs afterwards
- Head back to Dover for lunch before meandering towards the Tahune Adventures for a unique treetop view of the life cycle of a forest

Overnight Geeveston

Day 3 – Geeveston – Hobart

Distance and drive time: 100 km – 1 hr 50 min

- After breakfast, take in the scenery on the way to the Tasmanian Wooden Boat Centre at Franklin
- Head back to Huonville and join Huon Jet Boats on the river for the ride of a lifetime
- Make your way to Birchs Bay to taste award winning cheese at Grandveve Cheeses
- Have lunch at the Peppermint Bay restaurant with spectacular views to Bruny Island

Overnight Hobart

Day 4 – Hobart – Tasman Peninsula

Distance and drive time: 142 km – 2 hr 15min

- Try one of Hobart's many great cafes or bakeries for breakfast
- Head off towards Port Arthur and the Tasman Peninsula, stopping in for an oyster or dram on the way
- Take in the dramatic coastal landscapes of the Tasman Peninsula at Tessellated Pavement or Devil's Kitchen
- Join a guided tour at the Port Arthur Historic Site or simply wander around and soak in the history
- Join an evening ghost tour at the Port Arthur Historic Site

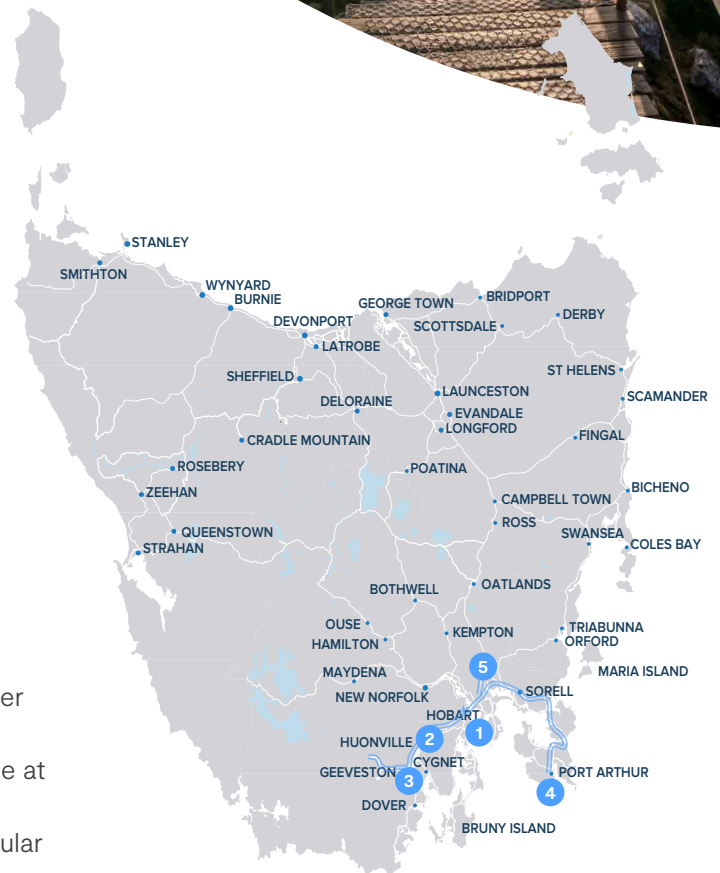
Overnight Port Arthur village

Day 5 – Port Arthur – Richmond – Hobart

Distance and drive time: 115 km – 1 hr 50 min

- Take a cruise to Tasman Island with Pennicott Wilderness Journeys and see Australia's highest sea-cliffs
- Leaving Port Arthur, head towards Richmond and walk across Australia's oldest stone bridge
- On the way back to the airport, explore the Coal Valley wineries and fromageries

5 DAY ITINERARY

Launceston and north

Day 1 – Launceston

Distance and drive time: 7 km – 20 min

- Visit Launceston City Park and stroll through the gardens
- See fine Tasmanian design at the Design Tasmania Centre
- Take the world's longest single-span chairlift over Cataract Gorge
- Join Tamar River Cruises and experience the beauty of the region from the water

Overnight Launceston

Day 2 – Launceston and West Tamar

Distance and drive time: 60 km – 1 hr

- Visit the Tamar Island Wetlands Centre and Reserve and take a short walk from the interpretation centre
- See the picturesque Tamar Valley from the top of Brady's Lookout State Reserve
- Take a drive through the Tamar Valley past vineyards, orchards, dairies, salmon farms, truffle woods and olive groves. Stop into any one of the tasting centres or cellar doors and have a chat with the locals
- If there's still time, visit Seahorse World and see platypus and echidnas nearby at Platypus House, Beauty Point

Overnight Tamar Valley

Day 3 – West Tamar to East Tamar

Distance and drive time: 166 km – 2 hr 25 min

- Head east over the Tamar River and towards the beach town of Bridport
- Play a round of golf at Barnbogle Dunes – an award winning links course
- Try award winning Jansz Sparkling at Pipers River
- Visit Hollybank Treetops Adventure and experience a zipline or Segway tour

Overnight Launceston

Day 4 – Launceston surrounds

Distance and drive time: 110 km – 2 hr

- Visit the historic village of Evandale
- Explore historic Longford and visit Woolmers and Brickendon estates
- Take a short walk to beautiful Liffey Falls or Pine Lake walk

Overnight Quamby Estate or Red Feather Inn at Hagley



Day 5 – Hagley to Devonport

Distance and drive time: 125 km – 1 hr 50 min

- Head to Mole Creek and tour the glow worm caves at Mole Creek Caves
- Stop at The Honey Farm in Chudleigh for honey tastings
- Visit 41° South salmon and ginseng farm at Deloraine and pick up some fresh smoked baby salmon
- Drop in at Christmas Hills Raspberry Farm Café for fresh raspberries
- Try a some uniquely Tasmanian wasabi or bush pepper cheese at Ashgrove Tasmanian Farm

Depart Devonport Airport

5 DAY ITINERARY

East Coast

Day 1 – Hobart to Coles Bay

Distance and drive time: 190 km – 2 hr 40 min

- Depart Hobart to embark on the Great Eastern Drive from Orford
 - Drop in at Kate's Berry Farm before Swansea for a delicious fruit pie with rich vanilla ice cream
 - Stop for lunch and wine tastings at Devil's Corner cellar door – and don't forget to take in the view from the award winning lookout
 - Drive down the peninsula to Friendly Beaches for a stroll
 - Enjoy fresh seafood at The Bay Restaurant, Freycinet Lodge
- Overnight at Coles Bay

Day 2 – Coles Bay

Drive times and distance: 8.7 km – 10 min

- Watch a spectacular sunrise from Honeymoon Bay
 - Take a kayaking tour with Freycinet Adventures in clear waters near The Hazards
 - Join a Wineglass Bay Cruise from Coles Bay to see iconic Wineglass Bay
 - Enjoy local wine and fresh produce at the Geographe Restaurant in Coles Bay
- Overnight at Coles Bay

Day 3 – Coles Bay to Bicheno

Distance and drive time: 71 km – 1 hr 20 min

- Take the walk up to the Wineglass Bay lookout for a spectacular view
 - Drive out to Cape Tourville Lighthouse and lookout
 - Head to Bicheno, stopping at the Farm Shed East Coast Wine Centre to taste east coast wines and shop for local art and craft
 - Take a twilight tour with Bicheno Penguin Tours and see fairy penguins in their natural habitat
- Overnight at Bicheno

Day 4 – Bicheno to Launceston

Distance and drive time: 236 km – 3hr 35 min

- See native wildlife at East Coast Natureworld including devils, echidnas and wombats
 - Stop at Iron House Brewery for craft beer tastings and stay for lunch
 - Head to Launceston, stopping at Pyengana Dairy to try their award winning cheeses
- Overnight Launceston

Day 5 – Launceston

Distance and drive time: 27 km – 37 min

- Take a gastronomical Taste.Walk.Talk day tour around Launceston's restaurants and bars
 - Ride the world's longest single-span chairlift over Cataract Gorge
 - Stop in at Josef Chromy for wine tastings on the way to the airport
- Depart Launceston Airport



5 DAY ITINERARY

West Coast

Day 1 – Launceston to Cradle Mountain

Distance and drive time: 141 km – 2 hr

- Drop into Christmas Hills Raspberry Farm on route to Cradle Mountain
 - View the world-class murals at Sheffield
 - Take a closer look at Tasmanian devils at devils@cradle
- Overnight Cradle Mountain*

Day 2 – Cradle Mountain

Distance and drive time: 11 km – 20 min

- Walk Dove Lake in Cradle Mountain - Lake St Clair National Park
 - Relax at the Waldheim Alpine Spa
 - Check out the Wilderness Gallery at Cradle Mountain Hotel
 - Take an after dark stroll around your accommodation and meet some of the local native animals
- Overnight Cradle Mountain*

Day 3 – Cradle Mountain to Strahan

Distance and drive time: 140 km – 2 hr

- Take the morning to drive to Strahan and enjoy the scenery on the way
 - Take a scenic flight with Strahan Helicopters for an amazing view of the Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area
 - Drive to Henty Dunes and watch the sunset at Ocean Beach
- Overnight Strahan*

Day 4 – Strahan

- Take a cruise with World Heritage Cruises on the Gordon River into the Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area
 - Watch out for platypus on the short walk to Hogarth Falls in Strahan
 - Have a laugh with The Round Earth Company's production of The Ship That Never Was
- Overnight Strahan*

Day 5 – Strahan to Hobart

Distance and drive time: 301 km – 4 hr 40 min

- Visit the Wall in the Wilderness, a 100m hand carved sculpture on display at Derwent Bridge
 - Head back to Hobart, stopping at Lake St Clair Visitor Information Centre for a short walk to the lake.
- Depart Hobart Airport*
